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ATTENDANCE MONITORING PROGRAM

Absences affect a student's performance at school. The Education Reform Act (1990) clearly states that students between the ages of 6 and 17 must attend school each day the school is open for instruction. An explanation (by note, phone call or interview) for any absence, **including late arrival**, is required by law and must be received by the school within 7 days of the absence.

Western Region is implementing several Attendance Initiatives. The focus of the program will be to address attendance issues through improved communication between the school and the community. Some of the initiatives include:

- 1) Increased number of home visits to conduct interviews with parents in an effort to resolve attendance issues;
- 2) Student interviews at school;
- 3) Phone contact;
- 4) All parents, with children whose attendance is a concern (and students) will be asked to engage in a Personalise Attendance Plan.

The outcome of this initiative is aimed at improving attendance and reducing truanting.
