Sport and Recreation NSW has offered swimming lessons for Kindergarten and Year 1 (only) during this term.

The dates are Monday 26th November, 2012 to Thursday 6th December, 2012.

Students will be going to the pool in groups at different times of the day between 9:30am to 1:15pm.

Students will be transported to the pool by the school bus

Students need to have the blue form and white form filled in and signed by a parent or carer before they can attend the swimming program.

INFANTS/PRIMARY NEWS

I would like to remind all parents of children in Kindergarten and year 1 The Learn to Swim program commences on the 26th of November at the local pool. Children need to bring the permission note and form back to school as soon as possible. Sport and Recreation NSW have placed even more importance in this program for our children by ensuring there are now 3 qualified swim teachers available at each session at the pool. If children do not bring back notes they cannot attend the program. The last time the program was here we saw huge improvements in the children's understanding of water safety and swimming skills. There is no cost to you for this program. Sport and Recreation NSW cover all pool entry fees. If you have any concerns about the program please do not hesitate to contact me at school so I can answer any questions.

Our Friday sport sessions at the pool will have commenced this week. Sport is a compulsory part of the NSW curriculum in schools and it is expected students participate in the program. Your child should have a note as to why they cannot swim otherwise it is expected all children (K-6) will be swimming. Students are placed into swimming groups and practice both water safety and lessons focus on developing swimming skills. Kindergarten is generally in the small pool and less confident swimmers are at the shallow end. Your child should come equipped with a towel, appropriate swimwear, hat and sun screen. We have found children should change at the pool rather than wear swimmers to school especially if they do not have a change of underwear after swimming. If you do not have a season pass to the pool entry is \$1.50 per week for every child.

Last week Kindergarten and years 1 and 2 spent some time at the Geoff New Oval with Country Rugby League staff learning skills for netball and league. One of the favourite games was the adaptation of "Red Rover" with all children having to wear a tag which had to be pulled off to be caught out.

Country Rugby League is trying to organise a similar day at school early in December for Primary children. Next week (22nd of November) Netball NSW are providing a skill development session for girls in the Primary. I know we have some keen netballers so this is a good opportunity for the girls to improve their skills.

Students in year 5 have been asked to prepare a speech if they would like to run for school captains for 2013. Students will need to present a speech at an assembly in the next few weeks and prove to the students why they should be considered for the position of captain or vice captain (1 boy and girl captain: 1 boy and girl vice captain). After all nominees have presented their speeches, every student in K-6 votes on a ballot form. Teachers and support staff also vote. Students with the most votes are elected captains; students with the next highest votes are elected vice captains. If your child is interested in being a captain/vice captain your encouragement and support writing their speech would be appreciated.

INFANTS/PRIMARY NEWS

Year Six celebrated 7 years of Primary school last week at the year 6 farewell. Every student looked fabulous and it was obvious all students had taken extra thought with their outfits. Some year 5 students gave up their time to be waitress/waiters and they did a wonderful job ensuring everyone was fed.

Our thanks go to Mr Horsfall, Sam Gordon, Kylie Gibson, Sarah Crabtree, Kim Hardy and Cynthia Moore who did so much organising for the night. Of course as usual Carol Barker found time in her day already packed with office duties to make the invitations, thank you cards and provide photos for the night. My thanks also to staff and parents, who did extras to ensure the smooth running of the night. I know office staff, particularly Sue Gordon, spent time laminating fantastic caricatures of each student. I think all year 6 had a fun time and will have fond memories of their farewell. Finally thanks to Mrs Walters who attended the night as teacher of year 6 for terms 1-2 and part of term 3. Students were especially pleased she attended the farewell.

Everyone knows the end of the year is approaching however learning and revision is happening in all classrooms. It is expected students will continue to participate 100% in classroom activities and work. We pride ourselves as a school which does not "wind down" early, rather teachers use every opportunity to continue to ensure students reach the highest reading and spelling level as possible before the end of the year. Students need to be focused and showing respectful behaviour all the time both in classrooms and in the playground. Consistent attendance at school is also expected. As the executive staff member monitoring attendance at our school I am required to continue to report any children to the Home School Liaison Program whose attendance is not above 85%. If your child is missing days please try to ensure their attendance improves. There can be serious penalties if your child's attendance is considered not to be meeting guidelines.

Year 6 boys have been included in the Clontarf Program running at our school. The program predominantly for secondary students has generously included year 6 boys as part of the boys' transition to secondary next year. Each boy is now on a contract and is expected to show good behaviour, attendance and complete class work to attend the program at recess, lunch and after school. I know some boys are also enjoying the early mornings with Jason and joining in AFL training. The boys are very keen to be part of the complete program next year in year 7.

Teachers are reminding children to wear a hat at school. My thanks to the parents who support this by providing a hat for their child/ren every day.

I am available most days after 2pm if you have any concerns you need to discuss.

Students in Secondary have had some great opportunities to join in a whole range of activities this past fortnight. Last Thursday a group of girls went to Bourke to participate in a Girls Only sport taster with some highly experienced female sports stars from the top of their field. Sports included league, union, netball etc. This week there is a Netball NSW workshop for girls in Years 3 -11. As the Clontarf Academy gets going we are also searching for equal opportunities for the girls to take part in.

The boys have joined with Clontarf for visits to Moree and Bourke for football and cricket. The boys had a great time staying overnight at Bourke High School and enjoying the company of the other students involved in Clontarf from the other schools.

The boys from Clontarf have been training hard to get fit and having the incentive to participate so they are able to join in the other activities including an excursion to the Gold Coast.
