INFANTS/PRIMARY NEWS

Dear Parents/Carers

Kindergarten and Year 1 are having a great time at the pool each day with the swim program. The hot weather is helping encourage children to go to the pool however every child is remembering their swim clothes and swimming in the program every day. This is a first that we have every child swimming for a long time. Their progress is wonderful. By the completion of the nine day program we should see more children confident and safe in the water. Having three teachers teach the swim program means children are receiving more instruction time and personalised support. Usually the last day of the program, (Thursday 6th December) is a time parents are especially invited to watch their child at the pool and see the progress made.

Swimming on Fridays is also going well. Last week nearly every child from K-6 was in the pool. Most children enjoyed the extra time they were given to practice their swimming skills. Children have been assessed in their swimming abilities and placed in groups so they can improve swimming skills. As the pool is the social place in the summer holidays it is good to know children are becoming more water safe and confident in the water. Entry to the pool is \$1.50 for Fridays. The swim program for K and year 1 is free. Thank you for supporting these programs by ensuring your child is equipped either every day or on Fridays for swimming.

Primary teachers are finishing reports for this semester. Your comments on our new format would be appreciated if time allows at the end of the year or early next year.

Teachers have also nearly completed final testing for the year. Our overall results indicate students have improved in spelling, reading and maths. Teachers have been discussing classes for next year and the best way to keep the growth of student improvement continuing by organizing smaller groups for lessons in reading and maths.

Year 5 students who wish to be considered for school captains or vice captains for 2013 are preparing speeches for Friday's assembly. The whole Primary school K-6 will vote early next week to decide the captains/vice captains. Traditionally we have a girl and boy captain and a girl and boy vice captain. The successful students who will take on these roles will be announced at presentation day.

Please ensure your child continues to come to school every day. Work is still being done in classrooms and teachers are preparing students by revising skills and knowledge ready for next year. Finding the time in the holidays to read to your child/ren or have them read to you will keep them in the habit of reading and give them a good beginning at school next year. Many times teachers find the improvements made at the end of each year are lost when children return the following year. Teachers will start to send work home in the next week or so.

My thanks to parents who made sure their child attended school regularly. As you know research shows children who come to school regularly if not every day generally learn better than children whose attendance is not regular. The Home school Liaison Officers continue to monitor the student attendance and will recommend referrals to them for students whose attendance is less than 90% over a term.

As with every year we say farewell to some members of staff. Ms Nicholls, Ms Kellett and I have tried every argument to have Mr Paul stay for another year however Mr Paul has decided to retire. Mr Paul has worked at Brewarrina Central School for three years. He has worked with individual students, groups and classes. He has improved the reading ability of every child he has tutored as well as produced confident happy readers. Mr Paul has worked with Year 2 in maths every day this year as well as with Mr Warren last year and I personally would like to thank Mr Paul for his support in the classroom with Year 2. He also campaigned to have the after school literacy centre start which ran for part of 2011 as well as supporting breakfast club. Students know he is the conscience one of us all to keep the school clean. Thank you Mr Paul for working so hard, putting in the long hours and time for every individual student you worked with. Every student you have taught has benefitted greatly from your compassion, expertise and humour. You will be missed in 2013.


This week, students practiced making stick figure characters out of newspaper clippings. The students are very proud of their work so far.

Having asked Year 10 some of the more memorable topics studied this year, this is what they had to say:



This is different to earlier migration patterns in Australia's history like after World War 2. At that time migrants mostly came from Italy, Greece and Great Britain."

Nathan Johnson performed well and prepared an insightful poster capturing some water management issues that concern the Darling-Barwon River (pictured).

Charlotte Boney – "We learnt how salinity can stop the trees from growing. The top soil can then be eroded by being washed or blown away. Once the top soil has been eroded it is difficult to use the land for farming crops or grazing."

PARTY SAFE TIPS FOR YOU AND YOUR FAMILY.

This time of year, there are many opportunities to celebrate, socialise and party! Longer daylight hours encourage us to relax, be social and enjoy end of year and festive season celebrations.

Having a party at home or at a local venue can be great fun. You'll want to have a party your guests will remember for the right reasons. As a host, it is your responsibility to ensure your guests party safe! The BRICCS Project, an initiative of the Far West Medicare Local, and Bourke and Brewarrina Alcohol working groups suggests these tips:

- Adult parties where it is likely that people might drink heavily are no place for children. Arrange for children to be supervised by a responsible adult at an age appropriate safe location.
- A party venue needs to be safe and large enough for the number of guests.
- Notify the police that you are having a party and have emergency numbers handy. Call the local police immediately should trouble occur. In an emergency call 000.
- Provide security at the venue to prevent unwanted guests and unwelcome behaviour. You have the right to refuse entry to your property. Do not invite guest who have are likely to be disruptive or trigger an aggressive event.
- Limit the number of invitations and guests. Only allow invited guests at the party.
- Ensure that there is plenty of food available.
- Make non-alcoholic drinks freely available and easy to access.
- Supervised access to alcoholic drinks for over 18's. Remember that it is an offence to serve or provide alcohol to anyone under 18.
- Keep parties for under 18's alcohol free.
- Arrange for young party goers to be collected at an agreed time, and plan ahead for designated drivers to prevent drink driving.

Smaller parties and social gatherings can be disrupted by consumption of alcohol and other drugs. Have a safety plan in place in order to prevent harm to your family, friends and property.

Remember, it's your party and you have the right to set the standard of acceptable behaviour and see that it is followed. You also have the right to ask people to leave.
