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This term our swimming program has been a fantastic success. Years 3, 4, 5, and 6 have learnt water polo at the pool on Friday and enjoyed competitive games last week.

Kindergarten, years 1 and 2 have continued improving swimming skills and learning safe practices in the water.

The Kinder- year 1 swim program was the most successful so far with every child who came to school swimming every day. The progress of the children was evident last week. Most are now more confident in the water, can float on their front and back and can jump safety into the pool.

We are organising the program for term 1 next year so this year's kindergarten will again have another opportunity to improve their swimming skills. Our thanks go to Jackie Bromfield who assisted as an instructor with this program. We aim to have the program early March when the weather is still warm.

Classes have been organised for next year and at this stage we are anticipating the following arrangements.

2 (two) year 1/2 classes
Year 3
Year 4/5
and Year 5/6.



We also have two teachers designated as Support Teachers Learning (STL) who will continue the program Mr Paul has implemented for the past three years – working with individual children to improve literacy skills and assisting in specific classes. We may need to make changes depending on enrolments, however, this is the basic structure we will commence the year with.

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### INFANTS/PRIMARY NEWS

We will continue with intensive reading groups for years 1-6 and some classes will combine for intensive literacy work in the mornings. Classes will also concentrate on numeracy lessons where students may be grouped according to their skills and knowledge of topics studied.

The first two days of school in 2013 for teachers will focus on Aboriginal Pedagogy, and mandatory areas such as Child Protection and the Department of Education and Communities Code of Conduct policy. As well, Primary teachers will be organizing groups and timetables. Teachers return to school on February 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. Children return on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> of February. Kindergarten will have a later start while children complete "Best Start", a testing program which determines each child's skills as they commence Kindergarten. Parents whose child attends Kindergarten in 2013 will have been informed of the day their child will come to school for the rest.

As I have mentioned in previous newsletters teachers are very pleased with the general progress students have made academically this year. We have seen considerable growth in spelling results from term 1 to term 4 and improvements in reading benchmarking levels (levels which determine a child's reading ability as well as comprehending text). Numeracy improvements are evident though we still need to further develop student understanding on how to work out problems.

Unfortunately another teacher is leaving our team. Mrs Jessica Fares has accepted a teaching position. Jessica has taken on extra jobs in the school including dance, art, and provided students in choir with the wonderful opportunity to compete in a song writing competition and travel to Sydney earlier this term. She is an enthusiastic teacher who has ensured year 1 has had many wonderful learning experiences. We all wish her the very best in her new job.





To every parent who made sure their child came to school as much as possible, to every parent who helped their child at home with school work, to every parent who has taken the time to visit a classroom, come to assembly, sporting event or carnival, traveled to see their child compete at carnivals at Bourke, Engonnia, Dubbo, Wellington, Cobar, Coonamble and Sydney, to every parent who has ensured their child is equipped for swimming, sport, excursions or other occasions, I would like to sincerely thank you for supporting the staff and Primary department this year.
