SCIENCE REPORT

SECONDA

Years 7 and 8

Year 7 and 8 recently completed a week long practical. They designed, tested and built a device to stop a raw egg from breaking when dropped from a one storey building. They will begin a new topic "Getting Things Sorted", which looks at how scientists organise living things.

Years 9 and 10

They have just started a new topic "DNA and Evolution" which looks at how plants and animals have evolved over time and how traits like eye colour are passed from parents to children. They will have a series of mini quizzes every week, instead of an hour long end of topic exam, so it's important all students attend regularly.

<u>Year 11 Senior Science</u>

They have just started their last topic in Preliminary Senior Science, called "Humans at work". It looks at how the Occupational Health and Safety act helps keep people safe. Note that all year 11 students become year 12 students in Term 4 this year.
