The PLP process is a great tool for identifying individual needs for every student, as well as allowing students to reflect on their own learning. Teachers also factor in these PLPs when they program for their class.

Unfortunately, we did not win with our entry into the Safe Schools Competition. However, I think that myself and the students involved (from both Secondary and Primary) enjoyed ourselves immensely. A great group of students, and I thank them for their efforts.

A secondary assembly was held on Thursday, where a number of students received awards for application in class, as well as respectful behaviour and achievement. It is wonderful to give our students such positive recognition for the hard work they put in at school. Our school captains, Briane and Edward, also did a great job running the assembly. We will be having an assembly once a term, as it is important to always recognize the positive achievements of our students. Parents and carers are more than welcome to attend.

I remind senior students in particular to keep up with assessments and continue to study. It is difficult to maintain motivation when the end is so near, but all the work at school must be worth it. Please encourage your child to study and revise every day.

Clontarf continue to be a positive influence in the school, especially working with some of our sport-mad boys. I also see that they are giving some of the boys skills in problem resolution and leadership. It would be great if the older students were positive role models for our younger students.
