We have had a very busy term 1. Thanks to all the teachers and aides for their fantastic work in the classroom. They are supported by a wonderful office staff. #### **Big Picture Education**

From the start of term 2 students in Years 7 & 8 will be participating in a new program called Big Picture. The purpose of the program is to make students' learning more personal, and give them a greater sense of ownership of their learning. It is being co-ordinated by Sarah Trapman and involves four teachers and three aides, who will support the students in their learning. Their energy in developing this program has been inspiring.

Students will start each day with a 75 minute BP Advisory. They will work on structured personal projects. The first of these is the "Who am I" project which explores their lives so far, important people in their lives, plans for the future, interests and passions. Teachers and aides will work 1:1 with students through the term, keeping them on task and on track. At the end of the term each student will complete an exhibition with their parents, showing them the work that they have done, what they have produced and what they have learned.

There will be a parent meeting at the start of term to involve them from the beginning. It is important we work in partnership with all our children. We look forward to seeing them.

This week we say farewell to Carol Barker. Carol is a highly valued member of our office staff. She has been very knowledgeable, highly skilled and a wonderful person to have on our team.
