Regional Swimming Carnival 2014







Bre Central may be a small school, but we work hard to provide a range of learning opportunities for our students. Secondary students will participate in a Young Leaders Day. We will also be visited by the Senior Citizens, conduct a river safety program and participate in regional swimming. Health and wellbeing programs include Trachoma screening, Love Bites (Teenage Relationships and violence) workshop and dental checks.

This is where students are required to make a 5 minute video of a story told with music, movement and dance. Our Year 1 teacher Beck Crowther will be leading the entry. School facility upgrades

On Thursday 27 March a team of people from the Department, architects and construction companies will be visiting our school to look at a major upgrade of facilities. The highest priorities are an upgrade of the school oval and refurbishment of the classrooms.

The day will involve meetings and a community workshop. Key people participating will be the AECG, the Local Reference Group and staff.

Linkages with other schools

In the last two weeks we have forged new partnerships with schools in Newcastle to share and learn new ideas. A video conference was held with Wirrapang Public School in Gateshead. They presented to us their approach to literacy and numeracy. They have great ideas that will enrich our work. Early next Term Tonya Kellett will spend a week with them observing and sharing.

Three teachers visited the new Cooks Hill Campus in the centre of Newcastle and Hunter Sports High. Both schools use personalised learning programs developed by Big Picture Education so have a lot in common with our initiatives.

On the 19th March all Years 5-6 students will be participating in a River Safety Program so look out for the note coming home soon.


Bullying

Students are reading and enjoying


Singing




