Thank you to the Council- so important to give our students the chance to get a little taste of working life and think about some post school options. Our students have been fantastic representatives of our school and are learning lots.

Year 12 have completed their Trial HSC Examinations, and will now spend the rest of term preparing for their HSC. We still have Study Club running on a Monday afternoon and all our teachers are more than willing to offer time for students who need help with studying and preparing for the exams. Our Year 12 students have shown great initiative this term, coming into school and giving up their own time (as well as that of their teachers) to get Major Works completed in Industrial Arts and Visual Arts. All Industrial Arts Major Works were marked this week by external markers. The Visual Arts Major Works have now been packaged and sent off for marking.

NAPLAN results have been sent to schools- There is a continued push for online testing, and many of our students have already trialled the platform. Students should always ensure they:

- *Arrive on time
- *Stay in class when it is class time.
- * Stay in designated play areas during break times

This means that students will have more learning time and fewer interruptions.

If students have permission to be out of class, they will need a pass or note from their teacher.

There are signs that show areas that are Out Of Bounds. Students should remain out of these areas. Staff actively supervise playground areas during break times to ensure safety of all students.

ATTENDANCE

It is a requirement that all students attend school. It is a parent responsibility to ensure their child is at school. If absent, the school should be notified of the reason. We have a very active Attendance Team that monitors student attendance and supports families so their children can attend school and have access to quality learning. Attendance is monitored weekly and the school works closely with the Home School Liaison Officers (HSLOs).


