#### Looking Ahead to Next Term...

**COVID-ILS (Intensive Learning Support)** is a **FREE TUTORING** program that is operating as a NSW Government and DoE (Department of Education) initiative to overcome any shortfalls in learning that occurred last year as a result of COVID.

At Brewarrina Central School this program will begin on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> April (Week 2) and will happen every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 3 to 4pm at the school during Terms 2 and 3. Please see the letter that is included in this Newsletter. It will also be put on the BCS Facebook page and was sent home with the students this week. I would strongly encourage ALL students from Year 1 to 12 to be involved in this TUTORING program where the students will be in AGE APPROPRIATE groups of up to 5 students. They will be tutored by teachers assisted by AEs and AEOs.

**ATTENDANCE** is the key to student success in education. Students need to attend school **REGULARLY and on time.** When they attend they need to **attend every class and be engaged.** Students need to accept their responsibility in their learning and that is to attend every lesson and make a genuine effort to do all that they are asked to do. # **K1K** News

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
K1K have had a wonderful term at Brewarrina Central School. They participated in the I Can program where they learnt a variety of games and skills to stay healthy and fit.

#### English Happenings,

### Term 1 2021.

English students in the high school are still settling in and understanding their strengths and areas for focus and development. With Easter just around the corner, they need to know that every lesson counts. Our PBL Focus across the school has been 'Following Instructions' with this supporting 'Classroom Expectations' that was our PBL Focus earlier in the year. Check-in and ask your child what the PBL Focus has been and what they think is the most important for their learning and engagement in the classroom.

English is the only mandatory subject in stage 6 for our year 11 and 12s. Year 12s are itching to get their schooling, "over already," as they say. I'm sure they will be missing us as soon as school finishes when they complete their 13<sup>th</sup> year! Alas, two terms to go until year 12 complete their HSC. However, our year 12s have just completed their half yearlies in week 8 and already have their eyes on the horizon.

Year 11 are well on their way with their participation in the Rural English Learning Exchange where we share our lessons with partner schools like Wellington, Ashford and other rural places. This is an exciting journey, especially since our students get to compare with other remote or rural schools. Let's expand their Brewarrina bubbles!

Each year our new year seven class study a unit called 'A Monster Calls' which allows them to experiment in critical and creative writing. We identify and work with various language techniques and devices such as punctuation, sentences, style and structure and study literacy in context. Below is an image of one of our works in progress. Punctuation task, where students have to hunt the hints such as where to use speech marks and other punctuation like questions marks that allow the reader to follow the story and meaning closely.

Students are concentrating on building their skills in vocabulary, sentence writing, and punctuation as well being confident in making creative decisions in their writing.

Year eight are writing a letter, biography, speech and a presentation for their summative assessment for their unit on 'Australian Heroes'. Each have chosen a different Australian Hero. See them in action below:



Our combined class for year 9-10 have been busy working on their media unit, studying how teenagers are portrayed in the media. They have analysed a range of media texts from the news to documentaries to see how different perspectives of teens are portrayed.

Looking ahead, we have 'Film By' visiting to revisit the local short documentary year nine last year were creating at the start of term two. Excitingly though, we could have ABC Heywire Remote Voices visiting towards the end of term two to visit our students and really hear their voices.

#### Australian Early Development Census


Between May and July 2021 Brewarrina Central School will be taking part in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).
