HSC exams have been completed. Five students from BCS prepared for the exams which were delayed by covid. Congratulations to Kieran Boney, Lara Bennett, William Dennis, Chloe Gordon, Steven Salt & Clayton Walsh who completed their schooling at BCS and receive a HSC.

2021 has seen a number of changes in staffing in our secondary department – some of those staff are leaving us at the end of the term – thank you for your work at BCS and best wishes for the future – Suellen Symons, James Peterson, Val Devlin, Angela Braid and Shane Garnett.

Year 6 have recently experienced a great **transition to secondary** school and teachers presented wonderful learning experiences for them over the three weeks of the program.

Year 9 & 10 have been busy cake decorating in **Food Technology.** 



During Term 3 & 4 students have participated in on-line tutoring – delivered via Teams to support students through the Covid intensive learning support program – we are fortunate that – along with many other western schools we will be able to continue to support our students in this initiative in 2022. As everyone is aware covid has interfered with onsite learning at school however all staff and students made the best of the situation and continued to provide great support with learning and through regular wellbeing check-ins. **Final reports** have been prepared and will be available at the end of term. All our learning in 2021 has been considered in preparing our end of year reports.

**RUOK and Battyr** - both organisations look after our mental health – students in Yr. 9 & 10 recently participated in a zoom presentation from Battyr and RUOK provided a pack of goodies including footy socks, drink bottle, stickers, keyring etc. As we were in lockdown during RUOK it was important to revisit the need for good mental wellbeing for all of us.



**Presentation Day** – another great opportunity to highlight the great things that happen at our school and acknowledge the students who make an effort in the whole school year. Mrs Trapman once again presented a highly organised event. There were some awards were not able to be presented due to the impact of covid however it was great to see so many students acknowledged for their work in 2021. Well done.



#### Getting ready for 2022

Our planning for 2022 will support all secondary students to engage positively with their learning. All students will have the use of a new laptop every day at school – we have purchased one per students along with headphones. At the start of each school day there will be a process in place to collect their technology and the same at the end of the day to place their laptop in the charging station ready for the next day. At the beginning of the school year there will be an Agreement to sign outlining expectations of use and care of their laptop. Each student will also receive a backpack, bookpack, calculator, student diary and a Yondr pouch to ensure ALL students always have the required equipment for every class.

In 2022 BCS secondary department will again be a phone free zone – this year we introduced Yondr pouches – the interruption of covid caused some issues with them however the expectation in 2022 is that they will be fully integrated into our wellbeing

and behaviour policy. Any student who destroys their Yondr pouch will be expected to pay for a replacement. The pouch works by placing all phones, earbuds / earphones etc into the pouch – locking it – keeping it in your backpack and unlocking it at the end of the school day. As all students will have their laptop, phones won't be needed to find information, use as a calculator etc.

#### Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)



Everyone is excitedly looking forward to the PBL Pool Day coming up. In 2022, the PBL team have many things we want to achieve. Thank you to a fantastic PBL Team, who are so dedicated and committed to improving practices and processes to support staff and students.

In 2021, all staffed were given ongoing professional learning in the foundations of PBL and understanding behaviour. This included training on trauma-informed practice. Staff also participated in the development of lessons and a scope and sequence that examines our core values of Safe Respectful Learners. We have a Behaviour and Wellbeing Policy that reflects the expectations that we have in our school and supports staff to ensure consistency of managing behaviour. We have a turnover in staff next year, so our aim is to ensure the maintaining of delivering professional learning that is relevant to our school context.

The PBL team has also been instrumental in the development of initiatives to increase attendance,

improve classroom learning environments and the wellbeing of all students. 2021 also bought the

introduction of the Student Voice Council which has been developing under the guidance of Mrs Turnbull.

A fantastic opportunity for our students to build their leadership skills and represent their peers as voice for change in our school.


