

Welcome to the 2023 school year at BCS. It is wonderful to see our students & staff return and be so keen to get back into our school routines and learning.

Staffing - We are currently advertising two positions which we hope will attract quality applicants that proceed to interview. These are for an English teacher and an Industrial Arts teacher. Coming up — This term we have plenty of activities happening in secondary and across the school. There will be a PBL Acknowledgement sometime in the term. Year 12 students will begin TAFE courses, and have their Half Yearly exams in Week 8 of this term.

We expect all students to come to school everyday with their backpack and books for all lessons. BCS has provided many of our students with new backpacks and book packs to support their learning. Students will be issued with a Yondr pouch and all phones and earpods etc are to be in the pouch. All students are reminded of the Phone Expectation at BCS. The automatic gates are now in action and if students are late they need to use the intercom to have the gates opened by the Front office.
